

RUMOURS & REALITIES



Rumour "Connaught is closing."

Reality The board has not said they intend to close the school. Connaught has a healthy population of over 300 students, and a full pre-K program.

Rumour "The foundation is beyond repair."

Reality The building can be fully underpinned for \$3.75 million, according to an estimate submitted to the board by W&R Foundation Specialists. However, without testing, the extent of required repairs remains unknown.

Rumour "It costs more to renovate than build new."

Reality The \$23 million renovation estimate for Connaught called for demolishing and completely replacing 90 per cent of the building, to accommodate an open concept design. Meanwhile, other school divisions have respectfully renovated buildings of similar age and condition for less than half that amount.

Rumour "The community will get to design a new building."

Reality The board is on record stating all new builds will follow an

open concept design. The province has said new builds will follow a "cookie cutter" pattern. There will be design consultations, but the basic structure will be pre-set.

Rumour "Our children will learn better in a new building."

Reality There is no empirical evidence linking open concept architecture to improved student achievement. Meanwhile, numerous concerns have been raised about the new designs.

Rumour "A new building will be safer."

Reality The board has said Connaught is currently safe for occupancy. It could remain so with repairs and maintenance. New buildings have safety features, but they also have health and safety challenges, including problematic security, unhealthy noise levels and off-gassing from large volumes of synthetic and composite materials.

Rumour "Old buildings cannot be made wheelchair accessible."

Reality Moose Jaw's historic schools, similar in age and structure to Connaught, have been made fully accessible.

Rumour "New buildings are better for the environment."

Reality A recent study by the Preservation Green Lab revealed it can take up to 80 years for a new energy efficient building to overcome the climate change impacts created by its construction. The thick walls and sturdy materials of older schools naturally retain energy, making for highly efficient buildings when retrofitted.

Rumour "Accepting a replacement plan will ensure a public school remains in the Cathedral Area."

Reality

New builds have shorter life spans and are designed to be more portable and easily disassembled. As well, it is unclear where a new build would be located, as the school's assigned catchment area is larger than the Cathedral Area, and boundaries are subject to change. Finally, the experience of Athabasca School tells us a promised new school is never a surety.

In contrast, a timely upgrade to a large, immovable, existing building represents a secure, long-term investment in our neighbourhood.
